<h2>Propane</h2>			
<b>Constituents</b>	Propane	<b>Hazards</b>	Extremely flammable Direct contact of liquid propane with skin causes burns Propane vapour is heavier than air, can collect in confined spaces
<b>Usage</b>		<b>Disposal</b>	Unlikely to harm the environment
<b>Precautions</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Return all cylinders to your supplier for re-filling and disposal.</li> <li>2. Never weld, solder or braze empty cylinders</li> </ol>	<b>Spillage</b>	<p><b>Eliminate all sources of ignition</b></p> <p>Allow to disperse in to the atmosphere.</p> <p>If safe to do so isolate the source of the leak.</p>
<b>Checks</b>		<b>First Aid</b>	
<b>Storage</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Store cylinders in upright position outdoors in a secure mesh cage.</li> <li>2. Store full and used cylinders separately.</li> <li>3. Keep naked flames away from storage area.</li> </ol>	<b>Inhalation (Breathing)</b>	Move person to fresh air immediately. If necessary administer artificial respiration and obtain medical attention.
		<b>Ingestion (Swallowed)</b>	Unlikely to occur.
		<b>Skin /Eye contact</b>	Wash contaminated area with water.  Obtain medical attention
