Except where varied in these rules, this competition will be judged in accordance with the Pony Club Show Jumping Rule Book as per below:

Preliminary Rounds and the Final will run in accordance with the current Pony Club Show Jumping Rule Book and The Pony Club Spring Festival Show Jumping Rules 2022/23.

Every eventuality cannot be provided for in these rules. In any unforeseen circumstances, it is the duty of the relevant officials to make a decision in a sporting spirit and to approach as nearly as possible to the intention of these rules.

In all Pony Club Show Jumping, excessive use of the whip, including repeated slapping down the shoulder, is prohibited. The rules state that the whip may be used a **maximum of three times** during any round. Use of the whip will be monitored, especially at the Final, and excessive use may result in elimination at the discretion of the judges.

SADDLERY & DRESS

At **Preliminary Round Competitions** either The Pony Club or British Show Jumping rules apply.

At the **Final**, The Pony Club Saddlery and Dress Rules apply.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Substitutions of horse/pony or rider will not be accepted at the Final.

QUALIFYING STAGES

There are two stages of the Barrier Spring Festival Show Jumping competition in Scotland & Northern Ireland:

1. Preliminary Rounds for Show Jumping will be held between April 2022 and 10th March 2023.
2. Those who were successful at the Preliminary Rounds will go forward to the Barrier Spring Festival Finals in April 2023 at Morris Equestrian. Branches at this stage may combine three or four qualifiers at any level to create a mixed level team from all classes, with no more than two members at the same level.

Eligibility Rules

FOUNDATION ELIGIBILITY

Riders must be aged 14 and under on 1st January 2022.

Riders are NOT eligible if they have previously completed at any PC80 (Grassroots) or above Area or Regional competition for Show Jumping

DEBUT ELIGIBILITY

Combination of horse/pony and rider are NOT eligible if they have:

- Represented their Branch/Centre at PC100 (Intermediate) or above at Summer Area Qualifiers for The Pony Club Show Jumping Final
- Been placed 1st – 3rd as INDIVIDUAL in the PC90 (Novice) or above Pony Club Show Jumping Final

Rider is NOT eligible if they have:

- Previously competed at the Winter Series/Spring Festival Open Grand Prix Final; or
- The Pony Club Show Jumping Final at Hickstead.

PC CHALLENGE ELIGIBILITY

Combination of horse/pony and rider are NOT eligible if they have:

- Represented their Branch/Centre at PC110 (Open) Summer Area Qualifiers for The Pony Club Show Jumping Final (this does not include any other classes held in conjunction with the Area Qualifier)

OPEN GRAND PRIX ELIGIBILITY

Riders CANNOT compete in the Open Grand Prix Competition if they have ridden in the Debut Competition in the same year.

It is not necessary to qualify for the Open Grand Prix Competition, entries can be made directly for the Final.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Multiple Horses – competitors may qualify a maximum of two horses for the Final in any one class. In the event of a rider qualifying more than two horses for the Final, they must nominate which two they will take at the Preliminary Round. The other qualifying place will be passed down the line.

Multiple Riders – horses may be ridden by up to two different riders at a Preliminary Round but by only one rider at the Final.

Multiple Levels – subject to eligibility, combination of horse/pony and rider CAN qualify for both the Foundation Championship Final and Debut Championship Final in the same year but CANNOT also take part in the Challenge or Open Grand Prix classes or Final.

Combination of horse/pony and rider CAN qualify for both the Debut Championships and PC Challenge Championships in the same year but CANNOT also enter the Open Grand Prix Final.

Combination of horse/pony and rider who has qualified at in the PC Challenge CAN compete in the Challenge Championship Final and enter the Open Grand Prix Final.

Riders cannot compete in more than two consecutive classes per day on the same horse/pony. Horses/ponies cannot compete more than once in each class or in more than two classes on the day.

NEW! TEAM COMPETITION – SHOW JUMPING, ARENA EVENTING AND DRESSAGE

Should a Branch/Centre have three or four members qualify at any Preliminary Competition, at any level, these members can combine to compete as a mixed level team at the Spring Festival Final. The team members can compete at different levels with **a maximum of two members at the same level**. A team must comprise of at least three members (i.e., one member may ride two horses) and the top three scores to count at the Final. Teams must be declared prior to entries closing for the Spring Festival Final in March.

TEAM COMPETITION SCORING

Points shall be awarded to each team competitor depending on their placing (1st =1 point, 2nd = 2 points etc.) relative only to other team competitors in that class and not on their overall placing in that class. Any competitors riding as an individual in the same class as team competitors should not be given points. The points for the three best-placed team members shall be added together to give the team score. The winning team will be the team with the least points.

INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION SCORING

The winner will be the horse/rider combination who have the fewest jumping penalties and fastest time.

Preliminary Round Rules – Foundation, Debut & PC Challenge

Held in Scotland & Northern Ireland (England and Wales have a separate Spring Festival) from 1st April 2022 – 10th March 2023.

Preliminary Round dates can be found on The Pony Club website.

There will be no Area Competitions for Scotland & Northern Ireland. Combinations who qualify at their Preliminary Round will go on to the Scotland & Northern Ireland Spring Festival Final.

Pony Club members and non-members may compete and qualify at Preliminary Rounds in Area 1, 17 or 19. Non-members in a qualifying position must join before the date of the Final if they wish to compete.

NUMBERS TO QUALIFY

The first TWO highest placed individuals from each Preliminary Round will qualify for the Final and be eligible for their Branch team selection. Branches may make up as many mixed level teams as they can from their qualifiers.

The first TWO highest placed from Area 1, Area 17 and Area 19 in each section at each Preliminary Round and any tying for these places qualify for the Final. Competitors may qualify a maximum of two horses and/or ponies for any one Championship Class. Riders/horses/ponies and/or combination of horse and rider can qualify for more than one Championship Class.

Qualifiers must have jumped a clear round in the first round or first phase if run under single or two phase.

PASSING DOWN THE LINE

On the day - If a competitor is unable to go to the Final then the qualifying places will be passed down the line. Please ensure every competitor confirms to the organiser/steward that they are intending to enter the Final. **Organisers should check the published list of recent qualifiers to ensure Qualifier places are passed down the line on the day.**

After the Preliminary Round – If a competitor is unable to go to the Final, they must notify area19@pcuk.org as soon as possible so that their qualifying place can be passed down the line. This will only be done **up until ten days prior to the Final.**

PRELIMINARY ROUND ENTRY FEES

Entry fee to be set by the organising Branch/Centre or Venue of this. The Organisers will be responsible for providing rosettes.

Please contact the relevant Show Secretary for details, these can also be found on The Pony Club website.

PRELIMINARY ROUND COMPETITION RESULTS

All Preliminary Round competition organisers must submit the results of their competition, including the combinations in a qualifying position as soon as the competition has finished. If the competition is cancelled or there are no qualifiers, please ensure the office is notified.

Please ensure you submit your results quickly after your event as this ensures the published list of current Qualifiers is up-to-date and passed down places can be offered.

Table A: One round not against the clock.

Placings to be decided by faults and in the event of equality of faults the time that is closest to an optimum time based on the Speed of 325 Metres per Minute. The optimum time will not be published until the end of the competition.

1 or 2 Double Combinations (uprights only) **0.75 m**

Maximum Height & Spread: **0.75 m**

Table A: One round not against the clock.

Placings to be decided by faults and in the event of equality of faults the time that is closest to an optimum time based on the Speed of 325 Metres per Minute. The optimum time will not be published until the end of the competition.

1 or 2 Double Combinations (uprights only) **0.85 m**

Maximum Height & Spread: **0.85 m**

When the second element of a double combination is a spread, the distances must be as for two non-jumping strides.

All Clear Rounds or the top 10 Competitors (from the 1st Round) will go through to the 2nd Round. In the event of equality of faults time will decide. All scores in the 1st Round will be carried forward to the second round.

Other competitors will be placed according to their faults and time.

All those placed equal first on faults for the two rounds will go through to the Jump Off which will be against the clock.

Other Competitors will be placed on faults and time.

Entry Fees

PRELIMINARY ROUNDS

Entry fee to be set by the organising Branch/Centre or Venue.

FINAL

Warm-up Competitions

Entry Fee: £20.00

Entries for competitors who have qualified for the Final, should be made through the organiser.

Championship Classes

Entry Fee: £28.00

Entries for competitors who have qualified for the Final, should be made through the organiser.

Entry deadline is 17th March 2023

Mini Major Eligibility

Open to any pony not exceeding 128cms to be ridden by registered members of The Pony Club up to the end of the calendar year in which the rider reaches the age of 12.

First Round max height 90cm. Table A7.

Any rider who has taken part in The Pony Club Mini-Major at Olympia in previous years is not eligible.

Members may enter as many of the qualifying rounds as they wish.

The top two of each competition will qualify for the final at The London International Horse Show (subject to eligibility, see below). All selection decisions of the Chairman of Show Jumping are final, and no correspondence will be entered into after the eight successful members have been announced. In all cases where the qualified member is unable to compete at The London International Horse Show, the qualification will pass down the line to the next eligible member.

In order to be selected for the Mini Major, the rider must have paid their Pony Club Membership fee in full and must have attended at least three Branch/Centre or Area rallies between 1st July of the previous year and the date of the qualifying competition. (Team training does not count as a rally, see the Pony Club Handbook for further information).

Members may enter as many of the qualifying rounds as they wish.

This is a direct entry qualifier class to be held at The Pony Club Barrier Animal Health Spring Festival 2023 at Morris Equestrian.

Mini Major Qualifier Class

Entry Fee: £25.00

Notes to Course Designers

It is recommended that a BS Panel Course Designer is used if possible.

It is important to use some 'fill-in material' so that the fences look inviting and hollow plastic poles are not allowed.

Safety Cups - Safety Cups are mandatory for all Pony Club Show Jumping Competitions including any practice fences. To be used on the back rails of spread fences and middle and back rails of triple bars

The Course:

- If possible, the first two fences should be sited to be jumped towards the Collecting Ring.
- One third to one half of the obstacles should be spreads and must include at least one square oxer.
- Distances - Unless the competition class stipulates the height of pony the distances should be for horses.
- In a course designed for a mixed class (horses and ponies) it is important not to use difficult committed distances so that ponies can adjust their strides. There should be no three stride distances anywhere in the course. There must be no less than five strides on the approach or following any combination, (either double or treble). Except where the rules for the competition stipulate and there is a significant mix of sizes of ponies/horses, one or two double combinations instead of a double and a treble may be better suited to the competition.
- When the second or third element of a double or treble combination is a spread, the distances must be as for two non-jumping strides.

Two Phase	First phase: 7 to 9 obstacles not against the clock with a time allowed. Clear rounds continue straight on to the second phase without a bell being rung.	Second phase: 4 to 6 obstacles which must be higher than the first phase. Competitors placed on faults and time
Single Phase	First phase: 5 to 7 obstacles not against the clock with a time allowed. Unless eliminated, continue straight on to the second phase without a bell being rung.	Second phase: 5 to 7 obstacles which must be higher than the first phase, (maximum 12 obstacles in all). Competitors placed on total faults from both phases and time in second phase.
