






Teams, Levels and ages

- The competition comprises a Mini and Junior/Senior competition. All teams can be made up with one member only who has also competed at another level in this year's competition provided they are eligible. Complete teams may not compete at more than one level.
- Mini Competition Teams to consist of four members. Members must be 10 years and under on the 1st of January of the competition year, with one member being 8 years or under on the 1st of January of the competition year.
- Junior/Senior Competition Teams to consist of four members. Members to be under 25 years on the 1st of January of the competition year. Two members to be 13 years and under on the 1st of January of the competition year. Two members of any age between 11-25.






Rounds – Question round (Mini and Junior/Senior)



- The question rounds will be a paper of 10 questions with multiple choice answers:
- The Pony Club (questions based on Structure, Governance, History, Competitions, Tests and Badges).
- Learning Theory (questions based on the test syllabus and Learning Theory Achievement Badge).
- Worm control (questions based on relevant sections of the test syllabus and Badge)





Round - Guess the Item - Mini and Junior/Senior



- Equestrian items placed in an opaque bag. Competitors feel through the bag and guess what the item is.
- This is one of the rounds where each team member will take part. Only the person feeling the item will be able to guess what it is.
- There will be 12 items in bags/pillowcases on the table and each team member will select three bags to feel and guess what the item is. Once a team member has put their hand onto the bag, no other team member may put their hand onto that bag.
- Example items body brush, hoof pick and stirrup iron.











- Equine General Knowledge
- Charades is a pretty classic game. Each member of the team takes turns to act out a word or phrase. The actor must not speak while the rest of the team try to guess what the word or phrase is. They can shout out as many guesses as they want.
- The team earn points for each correct guess and keep trying new words/phrases until the time runs out. If a player passes on a word/phrase the team cannot go back to that one.
- There will be 20 words/phrases available and they will be shown to each team in the same order.
- Encourage your members to use this game in their horse care training so that they learn common signals for things like 'tugging on the ear' for 'sounds like' etc.










- Handling and Leading
- Photo or video clips of correct and incorrect scenarios, you will then have to circle the unsafe practices or answer questions based on the photo or video clip





Round - Pictionary – Junior/Senior

One team member will draw an item and the rest of the team try to guess what they have drawn/are drawing. Each team member will take turns to be the artist and there will be a list of items to work through. The items will be general knowledge, which means it could be any item or action found throughout the syllabus and badges. Eg body brush, water bucket, saddle, feeding a treat.





Round - Taboo - Junior/Senior

 Players try to get their team to guess a word from the clues they give, only catch is there is a list of words that are "Taboo". Use one of them in your clue and you lose the point. Eg. The word is saddle but you can't use the following words in your clues: back, girth, ride (or any form of those words). The topic is rugs and bandages.








Round - Word Games - Minis

- Alphabet Soup Equine General Knowledge
- There will be a sheet with the alphabet on it and next to each letter a clue as to the word, teams have to work out the word and write it onto the sheet.
- Crossword Puzzle (Care of the Foot)
- There will be clues to each word both vertically and horizontally.





Round - Word Games – Junior/Senior

- There will be clues to each line both vertically and horizontally.
